BOEC Overview:

Due to the coronavirus pandemic, Brooklyn EOC transitioned to remote operations in March 2020, conducting all programs and services virtually. For the rest of the academic year, teaching, tutoring, advising, college access, and job placement services were offered through the student learning management system, Schoology, or by phone, email, and videoconferencing. At the end of the year, graduating students participated in a virtual Grad Fest by Zoom. Both students and BOEC staff rose to the challenge of navigating a new learning environment. BOEC did not close; we went virtual and continued to communicate and support our applicants, students, staff and community through email, the Center's website, and social media.
